OUR HISTORY



Impactful Education (IE) was born from the personal experiences of our founder, Katy Ballo, in Anyama, an impoverished city with very limited access to educational infrastructure. Katy had never seen a library or used a computer before immigrating to New York in 2013. This experience motivated her to provide a different future for the youth of her community by giving them access to the resources she lacked during her childhood.

In 2021, as a winner of the Davis Project for Peace competition, Katy secured a grant that allowed her to open the library at Collège Saint Michel, equipped with over 2,500 books and 15 computers.

The following year, Impactful Education was officially founded, building on the lessons learned from the Davis Project for Peace. In 2023, IE established an educational hub at Lycée Moderne d'Anyama, reaffirming its commitment to training a generation of educated youth, peacebuilders, and leaders.



SUMMER PROGRAM OVERVIEW



Our program offered a free and enriching experience to 50 young people from Anyama, aged 13 to 19. The 8-week program combined literacy and technology, featuring English learning classes, creative writing, fundamental reading skills, as well as group discussions and debates centered around collective readings. On the technology side, participants started with basic computer skills and progressed to using tools such as Scratch, Microsoft Office, and GIMP. Participants met with a local author and engaged in meaningful discussions with four emerging young leaders from their own communities. The program also included games, arts, and two excursions: one to the Adama Toungara Museum and Banco National Park, and another to Grand-Bassam, the former colonial capital.








IMPACT AND OUTCOMES



This summer, we enabled **50 young people** from Anyama to acquire the necessary skills to improve their **literacy and technology** capabilities. These young people are now better prepared to meet the challenges of their community and become the leaders of tomorrow, driving positive change.



During the first week, the program introduced participants to basic computer skills, ensuring they became familiar with computer functions and essential software, such as Microsoft Word, PowerPoint, and Typing. Simultaneously, participants worked on improving their spelling and grammar in French, which is crucial for strengthening their literacy and communication skills. This combination of technological and linguistic skills aimed to provide a solid balance at the start of the program.












This week's activities were designed to equip participants with essential skills for both academic and personal growth. Participants focused on enhancing their writing skills, helping them articulate their thoughts more clearly and effectively. Additionally, we continued lessons on the fundamentals of computer use, including key functions and shortcuts. This week aimed to strengthen both their communication skills and their foundational knowledge in technology.







This week, the participants focused on learning basic English vocabulary and presentations, which helped improve their language proficiency. In addition, they were introduced to coding with the Scratch language, providing them a fundamental understanding of coding and logical thinking. This week aimed to develop both their communication skills and foundational knowledge in coding.







This week, participants explored the culture and history of **Ivory Coast** since it was the week of **independence**, gaining a deeper understanding of their **heritage** and the **nation**'s journey to independence. In addition, they were introduced to **GIMP**, a graphics design software, which allowed them to work on **visual projects** and **develop** basic design skills. This combination of **cultural education** and **practical design training** aimed to broaden their **knowledge** and enhance their **creativity**.







This week, the participants began researching influential people in Ivory Coast, especially those who contributed to its independence, as it was Independence Week. They discussed among themselves in groups different historical events in the country, particularly the decade-long civil war, as well as its path to gaining freedom as a French colonized country. Additionally, they visited Banco National Park and the Adama Toungara Museum of Contemporary Cultures, giving them the opportunity to directly explore the country's natural and cultural heritage. These activities helped deepen their understanding of their nation's history and foster a sense of pride in their cultural identity.











During this week, participants took part in games like **Monopoly**, **Puzzles**, **Jenga**, which helped foster entrepreneurial thinking, critical thinking, and teamwork. They also participated in general knowledge competitions covering topics related to Ivory Coast, Africa, and the world.

They collaborated in groups by conducting **research** and using **PowerPoint** to create presentations on these social phenomena that impact their daily lives. This combination of **discussions** and **presentation creation** aimed to enhance their **analytical skills** and their proficiency in **Microsoft tools**.











This week, participants immersed themselves in **creative projects**, exploring various forms of **art** as a means to express their **ideas**. They also engaged in in-depth learning of programming with **Scratch**, which provided them with a solid foundation in coding. This experience included an introduction to creating their own projects using Scratch, fostering hands-on learning and enhancing their creativity.

Finally, a panel discussion with **four young leaders** was organized to share their thoughts and experiences, encouraging participants to continue their **studies** and become the **leaders** of their community.











This week, participants had the exciting opportunity to engage in a panel discussion with the writer **Mahoua S. Bakagnoko**. During this session, they learned about her books, explored her sources of inspiration, and received valuable advice on how to pursue a writing career.

We spent the entire day in **Grand-Bassam** discovering the history and culture of the **first capital of Ivory Coast**, which enriched our understanding of Ivorian heritage. We visited the *National Museum of Costume*, The *Palace of Justice*, *Royal Palace*, *Grand-Bassam Beach*, *Arts and Crafts Village*, the *Victory Bridge*. Additionally, they created projects using Scratch to produce animations, games, and storytelling, thereby enhancing their programming skills and creativity.









CLOSING CEREMONY



The closing ceremony of the summer program was a joyful occasion, bringing together students, parents, teachers, and local officials. Participants showcased their work through engaging presentations that highlighted what they learned during the eight weeks with us and the skills they developed, including English proficiency, digital literacy, the arts, as well as their experiences with games and excursions. They also presented projects created with Scratch, Microsoft, and GIMP. At the end, each student received a certificate and a school kit to encourage them to prepare for the upcoming school year. We were honored to have the presence of the representative of the Governor, Mr. El Haj Mory Sylla, the presence of Deputy Mr. Falikou Soumahoro, representative of the Deputy Diakité Ibrahime, and the Principal Mr. Yao Djatty. This event marked not only the culmination of a successful summer program but also a celebration of the students' growth and readiness for the upcoming academic year.






